MEET PRISCILLA BALCH

It was a lucky day for NCJW NY when Priscilla Balch joined shortly after she retired in 2001. She was attracted to the organization by the Jewish Women's Film Festival, a program of the Eleanor Leff Jewish Women's Resource Center (JWRC). Because of her dedication and leadership, within two years she was invited to be co-chair of the JWRC itself.

Priscilla says the JWRC could be called the feminist branch of NCJW NY, which is why she is so committed to its programs. "I am a feminist," she says proudly and has been since feminism became a movement in the seventies. The Film Festival promotes women's empowerment by specifically featuring films about Jewish women and their lives. Priscilla remarked that the Jewish world used to be much more conservative. "For example, women couldn't open the ark doors in front of the Torah, but today they do," she says. Over the years, the JWRC has



been involved in making changes to the Jewish liturgy and culture to include more women. The JWRC sponsors semiannual conferences focusing on topics vital to women's lives. This year's event will be about aging in place -- how to adjust and enjoy life.

Recently Priscilla became Co-Chair of the Management Council, joining Shirley Bisgeier in this role. The Management Council is made up of the chairs of all the NCJW NY volunteer programs. She explained that committee chairs have the opportunity to learn about the activities of other committees and find ways to work together. "It's a wonderful organization," Priscilla exclaims. She adds that there are opportunities for new volunteers to join many of the committees.

Priscilla was the head school librarian at Midwood High school in Brooklyn where she worked for 13 years. She says she had a good principal who believed in libraries. She enjoyed her job and was there to oversee the library becoming automated. It was hard work but she enjoyed it.

Priscilla is a bi-coastal woman. She has two sons; one lives in California so she travels to the West Coast 4 or 5 times a year to visit him, his wife and 3 grandsons. Her other son is a New Yorker who lives with his wife and "sweetheart" cat. Priscilla is a dog lover and over the years has adopted 3 beautiful beagles.


